Rick Peniston - Busy, successful, Charlotte Attorney has another passion

So what is Extreme Cowboy Racing? Founder and Hall of Fame Cowboy Craig Cameron began the organization and competitions at this Bluffdale, Texas ranch. Events are held throughout the world. Peniston travels to the events in the Peniston travels to the events in the Southeast, and as far West as the World Finals in Texas. Peniston's mount of choice is a eight year old paint, named Jake. "For Extreme cowboy racing you want a horse that trusts, pays attention, and has athletic ability," Peniston said. The competitions are made up of obstacles of varying degrees of difficulty. Loads of footwork, trust and practice go into developing the skill set for the horse and rider as they must maneuver through

and over obstacles with tight and over obstacles with tight narrow turns and keyhole type situations. "Speed with precision" is the concept developed by Craig

One of Peniston's joys of competition is that his wife Jane ravels and competes as well, Jane rades a seven year old paint horse mare, named Smoochie. In addition Jane and Smoochie, grandsor y rides 25 year old quarter horse

Rick grew up on a farm in Cuba, NY. Long winters allowed him time for hunting, fur trapping and 4H. He managed a stable during law school in what is now the Town of Fearington NC where the focus became dressage and hunter/ jumpers. For the last 30 years he has lived on his farm in Mint Hill, NC, and he and Jane have continued enjoying their horses. They were introduced to natural horsemanship more than 20 years ago by Dave more than 20 years ago by Dave Seay and have worked with many wonderful, well known trainers since then. They even explored the world of thoroughbred racing and had a successful allowance horse, but racing wasn't sufficiently "hands on" to fulfill their horsemanship

on" to fulfill their horsemanship urge: Rick went to a Craig Cameron Clinic in 2010 in Morroe and was immediately impressed. He started competing in 2011. He had already been ricing for 50+ years but through the Craig Cameron methods he learned how to ride off his seat and legs and stay out of the bridle. Rick had never really competed as an adult rider until he learned of the Extreme Cowboy Races and now he and Jane can' Races and now he and Jane can't get enough of the fun and family atmosphere that the sport offers Peniston is also an author having written Down Drowning Creek, a collection of humerous hunting and outdoor adventure stories available at <u>www.lulu.com</u>. **Bernie Duncan Memorial Educational Fund** 

Starting with the 2016 show season, SOCA will award \$500 to the high point youth rider at the Obstacle Challenges and \$500 to the high point youth rider at the Extreme Cowboy Races.

The youth/horse combination must compete in all 2016 SOCA Obstacle Challenges to be eligible for the \$500 Challenge Fund Award.

The youth/horse combination must compete in all 2016 SOCA Extreme Cowboy Races to be eligible for the \$500 Race Fund Award.

The Youth must be a paid member of SOCA for the 2016 season. The same youth can win both awards if they attend all races and challenges.

There is no application or fee to be included, with the exception of dues and entry fees for each event.

# Can have fun!REMINDER!!!!What's new for 2016SOCA 2016 DivisionsEXCA Rule Changes

**Divisions** - Please be honest with divisions entered – SOCA promotes a fair playing field for all skill levels. SOCA reserves the right to refuse entries for anyone purposely misrepresenting their abilities, as deemed by judges and officers. If you have questions about what division you belong in, please ask!!

- Youth Riders 17 & Under (limit of three horses per youth rider)
- First Year Horse & Rider (Amateur) Both horse and rider (non professional) are new to obstacle challenges and SOCA. Can only compete in this introductory division one show year (Jan – Nov).
- Novice Horse & Rider If you have won a SOCA event or any obstacle challenge, you are not eligible for Novice.
   SOCA judges or directors can determine that you should remain in Novice or should be moved up due to skill level. If you place in the top 3, three times in SOCA events, you must move up to Non Pro or Open Elite.
- Non-Pro (Intermediate Horse & Riders) Riders 18 & Over who do not accept money for training or riding horses. Riders may complete the year as Non-Pro, however, any rider placing in the top 3, three times, will graduate to Open Elite the next year.
- **Open Elite** This division is open to trainers and Non-Pro riders that have excelled in that division and graduated to Open Elite status. These are the top tier riders and horses, the SOCA Elite!
- Posse Horse/rider that is a certified member of any posse or mounted unit, or has trained with a posse.
   Posse or mounted unit riders can choose to compete in Non Pro or Open Elite, instead of Posse.
- Green Horse Training division for horses of any age, that are new to obstacle challenges, and riders of any level. Prizes and ribbons only, no payback or high point. Horses must move out of Green Horse after one win or after one show season (January – November).

- Novice Move Ups: At the end of the competition year, a decision will be made by the Executive Board as to whether or not to move a competitor out of the Novice Division. The Executive Board will make this statistical determination based on how many times a Novice has won their division and the number of competitors that were in the Novice division at each race. A rider who has been moved out of the Novice Division may petition the Executive Board to remain in the Novice Division. Intermediate Move Ups: At the end of the competition year, a decision will be made by the Executive Board as to whether or not to move a competitor out of the Intermediate Division. The Executive Board will make this statistical determination based on how many times an
  - Intermediate has won their division and the number of competitors that were in the Intermediate division at each race. A rider who has been moved out of the Intermediate Division may petition the Executive Board to remain in the Intermediate Division. An Intermediate rider may not ride "down" into a lower division.

### 2016 High Points

In 2016 SOCA will award high point <u>obstacle</u> <u>challenge</u> winners in the following divisions: First Year (Amateur), Novice, Youth, Non Pro, Open Elite and Posse. Points from each of the 2016 SOCA Obstacle Challenges will be totaled, with double points at the obstacle challenge championship in November. The horse/rider team with the most points will be the high point champion. Based on the feedback from members, the high point award will be custom SOCA buckles.

Regional Championship buckles for the Extreme Cowboy Races will be determined by points accumulated <u>at SOCA events only</u>. The horse/rider teams accumulating the most points at each <u>designated</u> SOCA EXCA race (with the triple points at the Nationals in June and Regional Championship races in September and double points for all State Championships) will be awarded the high point buckle in the following divisions: Pro, Non-Pro, Ride Smart, Novice, Intermediate, Youth, and Non-Pro.
