While everyone is making New Year's resolutions to hit the gym or read more books, let this be the year you set your sights on the barn. Become the best rider you can be! Spend more time in the saddle, work on developing your horsemanship, and foster a better relationship with your horse. By setting some obtainable resolutions, you can stay focused and work toward something that is important to you. You got this, cowgirl!

Horse-Inspired Resolutions

- Become a **better rider**. You can take lessons, attend clinics, and watch educational videos. Be like a sponge and absorb knowledge from all around you. Stop blaming your horse for their poor performance and start realizing you have more influence than most care to admit.
- Get a **good saddle** that fits properly. Too many riders pay little attention to the fit of their saddle. Don't let your horse ride around in discomfort. Hire the professional saddle fitter, save up for a quality saddle, and don't forget to check the rest of your tack while you're at it.
- Keep up your **fitness**. The better your balance, the more flexible you are, the stronger your core.... the better you'll ride!
- **Quality time** spent with your horse is never a waste. Let them know you aren't just there to ride. Spend time with them in their field, groom them, take them handgrazing, find a way to connect out of the saddle.
- Ensure your horse is receiving **top level care**. They'll perform their best when they're happy and healthy. Turnout where they can socialize, a proper diet, regular farrier schedule, and even bodywork can keep them in tiptop shape.

Let these resolutions inspire you! Ultimately, you'll need to create a list that matches your desires and needs. Your goals are unique to you!







With all of that extra hair, your horse will be a little more challenging to groom. Unless you clip your horse in the winter, their coat will come in thick and fuzzy. It collects dust, dirt, and moisture easily. You'll need to spend some time cleaning them up and checking for any issues. Long hair can easily hide skin infections or injuries. It's a great idea to get in the habit of regularly grooming and checking your horse over.

Winter Grooming Tips

- 1. Curry combs are a must! A rubber curry can be used in circular motions to drawl up dirt and dust. A metal or plastic one can scrap off any dried, caked mud.
- 2. Tails can get dirty with all of the extra mud in the winter, so many opt for a tail bag. Simply, shampoo and condition the tail, braid it up, and place a tail bag over it.
- 3. A silicone spray like Showsheen in the mane and tail will help dirt to slick right off.
- 4. Horse vacuums are amazing! They can blow the coat out or suck up the dirt and dust.
- 5. If it's too cold for a bath, consider bringing hot towels to the barn. By rubbing your horse all over with a slightly damp towel, you can collect dust from the hair.
- 6. A spot treatment, such as Cowboy Magic GreenSpot, can remove stains on a gray horse or one with white markings. No water needed!
- 7. Here's a simple hack for sweaty saddle marks... Put rubbing alcohol in a spray bottle, lightly mist the area, rub it in, and wipe off the excess. When the hair dries, your horse won't have sweat marks left behind.
- 8. If you need your horse to stay clean, you can always use a sheet or blanket. You must regularly take it off though and check for weight loss, skin infections, and wounds.
- 9. You might consider trimming up the hair on their pasterns, which will help reduce mud buildup and prevent scratches.
- 10. If you'll be doing a lot of riding, it might be time to consider body clipping even just a partial clip. Grooming will be a lot faster and the horse will cool down quicker.

Wet conditions and mud can cause many issues, so make sure to stay diligent and groom your horse throughout the week.


