



Novice Gaited Sport Horse Award Program

- Open to all gaited breeds entered in the Novice Horse & Rider Division at the five SOCA Obstacle Challenges in 2015. Gaited breeds include (but not limited to) Paso Finos, Peruvians, Tennessee Walking Horses, Racking Horses, Spotted Saddle Horses, Rocky Mountain Horses, Kentucky Mountain Saddle Horses, Icelandic Horses, etc.
- To be eligible, the horse and rider must not have won any obstacle challenges. You must indicate on the entry form the gaited breed you are entering. This is for the Novice Horse & Rider division only
- \$175 Prize purse for every SOCA obstacle event for 2015 Ties will be broken by obstacle time.
 - \$100 to the highest scoring gaited horse in the Novice Division
 - \$50 to the second highest scoring gaited horse in the Novice Division
 - \$25 to the third highest scoring gaited horse in the Novice Division
- Ribbons for 1st through 3rd to accompany checks
- High Point Year end award of:
 - 1st place \$500
 - 2nd place \$250

REMINDER – Changes to the Obstacle Challenge Divisions for 2015

- Divisions for 2015 will remain Youth, Posse, Novice, Non Pro, Open/Elite & Green Horse.
- Riders will be asked to move up to the next division if they place in the top 3 at least 3 times during the year (starting with 2014), with the exception of Youth & Green Horse.
- Green Horse (training division) is not a high point division one win and you move up to the riders appropriate division. A horse is considered Green for one show season and then they must move up.
- Posse will be open to any posse members, however, they can also show in any division (except Novice) that defines their skill level.
- Youth will be limited to a maximum of three entries per event.

Mark Updike

Mark Updike insists he isn't a horse whisperer. But the Palm City trainer's skill with feral and unbroken horses has built him a reputation as just that. Updike started working with horses as a boy at the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranch. He showed a natural ability, but his personal problems got in the way of his equine career. Three years ago, he had a run-in with the law in Jupiter. To work off his community service, Updike trained a few horses for the Equine Rescue and Adoption Foundation in Palm City. That experience was a turning point for Updike. The foundation recently called on him again to help with a pair of wild, unmanageable horses. His patient and calm technique as a trainer, coupled with his unique brand of showmanship, have earned him a place in the horse industry.

Mark Updike, as his alter ego Colt Robertson, giving a horsemanship demonstration. Updike uses theatrical elements to engage people's attention and teach them how to work with their horses. "I've never been certified by anybody," Updike admitted. "I studied John Lyons and read his books. I started to develop my own program based in gentle yet firm methodology. I've spent thousands of hours in the round pen and slowly developed a program I can call my own. When I explain something, it's my take on it. I'm not just parroting what I hear someone else say. I've learned the hard way. Through the hard way, I've learned how to explain things."



Updike's career is rooted in an experience he had with an unbroken horse at the youth ranch. While the rest of his classmates were riding their assigned horses, Updike sneaked out to visit an apparently dangerous, untrained Appaloosa he'd been warned to leave alone. "I wandered into the pasture with a halter, put it on that horse and rode him bareback all over the pasture," Updike said. "That was a huge no-no. I got in a lot of trouble, but they were surprised that the horse didn't kill me."

When Updike isn't quietly persuading wild horses to accept a bridle and saddle, he's giving demonstrations on what he does. Updike's presentations are far from dry and instructional. He uses magic and illusion to stand out from the crowd and entertain people while they learn. He turns into his alter ego, lone ranger look-alike Colt Robertson. "At a show a few months ago, I walked up to a lady with her big draft horse and told her that her horse couldn't hear her," Updike said. "I walked up and started pulling big handkerchiefs out of his ear. I started adding magic into my clinics as a way to keep people's attention and drive certain points home."

Updike keeps clients' horses at his home while they are in training. He boards them with his own horse, Buddy. Living with the horses full time gives him time to witness their transformation. That moment of realization is why Updike got into training after he left the Marines. "I love watching a horse change its mind from fear to trust," he said. "My job is to change their mind and recondition their response. Horses' intentions are pure and if I ask the right questions, they will give me truthful answers. It amazes me when they finally realize what I'm asking of them."



2015 High Points

In 2015 SOCA will award high point <u>obstacle</u> <u>challenge</u> winners in the following divisions: Novice, Youth, Non Pro, Open Elite and Posse. Points from each of the 2015 SOCA Obstacle Challenges will be totaled, with double points at the obstacle challenge championship in November. The horse/rider team with the most points will be the high point champion. Based on the feedback from members, the high point award will be custom SOCA buckles.

Regional Championship buckles for the Extreme Cowboy Races will be determined by points accumulated at SOCA events only. The horse/rider teams accumulating the most points at each designated SOCA EXCA race, with the triple points at the Nationals in June and Regional Championship races in September and double points for State Championships in January, April and June, will be awarded the high point buckle in the following divisions: Pro, Non-Pro, Ride Smart, Novice, Intermediate, Youth, and Non-Pro.
