



Novice Gaited Sport Horse Award Program

- Open to all gaited breeds entered in the <u>Novice Horse & Rider Division</u> at the five SOCA Obstacle Challenges in 2015. Gaited breeds include (but not limited to) Paso Finos, Peruvians, Tennessee Walking Horses, Racking Horses, Spotted Saddle Horses, Rocky Mountain Horses, Kentucky Mountain Saddle Horses, Icelandic Horses, etc.
- To be eligible, the horse and rider must not have won any obstacle challenges. You must indicate on the entry form the gaited breed you are entering. This is for the Novice Horse & Rider division only
- \$175 Prize purse for every SOCA obstacle event for 2015 Ties will be broken by obstacle time.

Learning To Learn by Craig Cameron

Learning is the response from a demand to grow or do something that you have never done before. Horsemanship, like life, is an unending journey of learning for both horse and rider. No person comes into the world knowing horsemanship. By the same token, no horse comes into the world knowing what the human is asking of him. In the art of horsemanship, the student is not only the horse but also the human. In this article the word 'student' will be applied to both entities.

In most cases, the human is the one who steps into the horse's life. It is the human who is asking something of the horse. And the horse is only asking for a fair deal. Unfortunately for the horse, there is no requirement of a license or education to ride or even purchase this amazing animal. I think most of us would agree that the majority of people who own or ride horses know little or nothing about the horse. The human is the one who must make the conscientious effort to become educated in the art of equine. Each person must put his ego aside, be truthful and seek out whatever it takes to learn horsemanship.

It has been my experience that the majority of humans who are starting out in horsemanship believe that the endeavor will be simple. To these people, horsemanship is 'kick it to go, pull it to stop' and 'why won't it do what I told it to do?' Truly, my favorite comment by novice horseman, (which they usually say in frustration), is "This horse has a mind of its own!" I always respond "Whose mind did you think he was going to have!?" In my opinion, the slowest and hardest way to learn horsemanship is to try and teach oneself.

Learning how to ride without instruction is like trying to cook an intricate meal without any recipe. I am often asked, "Where do I start?" To this I reply "The beginning would be nice!" Years ago, as a young horseman, I found information difficult to obtain and experienced horsemen close mouthed about their techniques. Most old horse masters got their knowledge through the school of hard knocks and they figured you ought to get it that way as well. Fortunately for horse people today, there is an abundance of readily available information through magazines, books, videos, clinics, instructors, and expositions.

To be great in anything, I think you must do it every day. If you cannot do it, you must think about it, visualize it, or read about it. With a little investigation, one can find out who the better horseman are in your area. Start with lessons and surround yourself with the world of horses. One thing will lead to another. You will meet new people and make new friends who have the same interest in horses. These are the seeds you plant and you nurture then with knowledge.

Horsemanship is a physical, mental, and emotional endeavor for both man and horse. Horsemanship is always a work in progress. I must warn you that it is hard work but if you love horses, it will be the most rewarding work you ever do. Learning is expounding, compounding, and mathematical. The more you learn, the more fun horsemanship becomes. Like anything worthwhile, the learning process can be frustrating. Do not let frustration get the better of you. With desire, determination, and dedication, anything will get better. As you hone your equine skills, it becomes easier for the horse to understand what you want and don't want. Remember that the horse seeks the level of the rider. Be patient and do not forget that your equine friend is learning as well. The horse, just like you, will have good days and bad days. This is part of the learning process.

Remember, as students of the horse, not only are we learning but we are also teaching. The horse is always learning something from us. Whether that something is good or bad will be up to you. To be a good teacher, you must first be a good student. When it comes to horses and horsemanship, the horse may be the best teacher. Don't forget to let the horse teach you as much as you teach him. Remember, teaching is the art of communication and communication requires TWO minds listening and TWO minds open-yours and the horses.

Pam Greene Bacon

Pam got her first pony, Trigger, at the age of 8, after begging for years. Her first word was "pony". Pam grew up on a strawberry farm, Greene Acres, which was next to a 300 acre dairy. She would help round up the cows for milking and fell in love with the cowboy world. She would pack a lunch in her saddle bag and be gone all day.

While riding a horse named Smokey when she was 10, she broke her collar bone. Six weeks later, after the cast was removed, Pam got kicked and broke her leg (probably due to her no fear attitude!) Her parents said "no more horses!" Trigger was sold.

Two years later, Pam had saved \$400 (mostly from school lunch money). Somehow, she talked her parents into letting her buy a quarter horse named Rebel and he was fast! Her best friend in high school ran barrels on a national level. Pam watched he friend compete, but was never allowed to herself. When Pam left for college, Rebel was sold.

In 1991, Pam was ready to buy another horse. The love she had as a child was still there, but she had back issues and wasn't sure that she could endure the jarring. Her chiropractor suggested she try a Tennessee Walking Horse so she found one named Stock Free. She put Stocker in training with Wayne Conkle and soon fell in love with the walking horse people (Tracy Pinson, Diana McMurtrey, Bernie Duncan and many others).

Pam is a member of the Florida Walking & Racking Horse Association, Sunshine State Racking, Walking & Spotted Horse Association, SOCA and the Extreme Cowboy Association. She owns four TWH's: Two Centennial Gold offspring and one by Mountain of Fool's Gold (aka Casper), who is a half brother to Wayne and Tracy's horse Skyjacker's Mountain High (aka Tuff). This year, Pam is showing CJ (Casper's son) in Green Horse. Pam also bought Peyton (His Power) from Bernie Duncan and competes with him at FWRHA and SSRWSHA shows, as well as SOCA obstacle challenges and EXCA races in the Intermediate and Ride Smart divisions.

When she isn't competing, Pam and Peyton visit orphanages where the children adore the horses and love petting them. Being around their spirits, the children open up, let down their guards and come out of their comfort zones.

Ronnie and Pam own Greene Acres Stables in Plant City, Florida where Pam gives lessons to help inform young riders the proper ways of riding TWH's. They host a SOCA event in March and hope to be able to host EXCA events in the near future. They also board outside horses at their farm.

2015 High Points

In 2015 SOCA will award high point <u>obstacle</u> <u>challenge</u> winners in the following divisions: Novice, Youth, Non Pro, Open Elite and Posse. Points from each of the 2015 SOCA Obstacle Challenges will be totaled, with double points at the obstacle challenge championship in November. The horse/rider team with the most points will be the high point champion. Based on the feedback from members, the high point award will be custom SOCA buckles.

Regional Championship buckles for the Extreme Cowboy Races will be determined by points accumulated at SOCA events only. The horse/rider teams accumulating the most points at each designated SOCA EXCA race, with the triple points at the Nationals in June and Regional Championship races in September and double points for State Championships in January, April and June, will be awarded the high point buckle in the following divisions: Pro, Non-Pro, Ride Smart, Novice, Intermediate, Youth, and Non-Pro.
